



## Bylaws of Go Beyond the Limit

### Article I: Name and Purpose

**Section 1: Name** The name of the organization shall be “Go Beyond the Limit,” hereinafter referred to as “the Organization.”

**Section 2: Purpose** The Organization’s mission is to empower survivors of domestic violence by providing training and resources to help them become successful online entrepreneurs. The Organization shall achieve this through online entrepreneurship classes, and access to relevant tools and technologies.

### Article II: Membership

**Section 1: Eligibility** Membership in the Organization is open to individuals, organizations, and partners who support the mission and objectives of Go Beyond the Limit.

**Section 2: Termination of Membership** Membership may be terminated for failure to adhere to the Organization’s policies, conduct detrimental to its mission, or non-payment of dues, as applicable.

### Article III: Board of Directors

**Section 1: General Powers** The Board of Directors shall oversee the governance, policies, and strategic direction of the Organization.

#### Section 4: Meetings

1. **Regular Meetings:** The Board shall meet monthly, via video meeting, eventually leading to bi-monthly meetings. Missing three meetings is grounds for disqualification from the board. **Please be prepared to be on camera for a more productive meeting.**

2. **Special Meetings:** May be called by the CEO or a majority of the Board members.
3. **Quorum:** A majority of the Board members shall constitute a quorum for decision-making.

## **Section 5: Officers**

1. **Chairperson:** Presides over Board meetings and represents the Organization.
2. **Vice Chairperson:** Assists the Chairperson and assumes their duties in their absence.
3. **Secretary:** Maintains meeting minutes and official records.
4. **Treasurer:** Oversees financial matters and ensures proper financial reporting.

## **Article IV: Programs and Services**

**Section 1: Training Programs** The Organization shall provide workshops, online courses, and mentorship opportunities tailored to the needs of survivors of domestic violence.

**Section 2: Resources** The Organization shall facilitate access to tools, technologies, and professional networks that support online entrepreneurship.

**Section 3: Partnerships** The Organization shall collaborate with businesses, nonprofits, and government entities to enhance its programs and extend its reach.

## **Article V: Finances**

**Section 1: Fiscal Year** The fiscal year of the Organization shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.

## **Article VI: Conflict of Interest**

**Section 1: Policy** All Board members, staff, and volunteers must disclose any potential conflicts of interest and refrain from participating in decisions where such conflicts exist.

## **Article VII: Amendments**

**Section 1: Proposal** Amendments to these Bylaws may be proposed by any member of the Board of Directors.

**Section 2: Approval** Proposed amendments must be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board.

#### **Article IX: Dissolution**

**Section 1: Procedure** In the event of dissolution, the assets of the Organization shall be distributed to a nonprofit organization with a similar mission, as determined by the Board.

#### **Article X: Miscellaneous**

**Section 1: Non-Discrimination** The Organization shall not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, or any other characteristic in its programs, hiring, or partnerships.

**Section 2: Indemnification** Board members, officers, and staff shall be indemnified against legal claims arising from their authorized actions on behalf of the Organization, except in cases of gross negligence or misconduct.
